* Brief reminder about Romans 13:1-2

Rom. 13:1 be subject to the governing authorities -- for there is no authority except from God -- the authorities that exist are appointed by God

* "from" God -- "appointed" by God

Amplified New Testament -- Let every person be loyally subject to the governing (civil) authorities. For there is no authority except from God -- by His permission, His sanction; and those that exist do so by God's appointment.

Rom. 13:2	therefore whoever resists the authority resists the ordinance of God, & those who resist will bring judgment on themselves
Acts 5:29	"we ought to obey God rather then men"
	* Resisting civil and religious governments
Exod. 1:22	Pharaoh wanting to kill babies Moses' mother saving her son
Josh 2:3-6	king of Jericho seeking to capture the 2 men from Joshua Rahab protecting the 2 men Heb. 11:31 and James 2:25
Dan. 3:4-18	King Nebuchadnezzar commanding the people to fall down and to worship his gold image Shadrach, Meshach & Abed-Nego refused
Matt. 2:7-16	Herod instructing the wise men to tell him the location of the child they did not
Acts 4:18-20 Acts 5:25-29 Rev. 13:11-18	the apostles resisting the council the apostles resisting the council again the second beast expecting people to worship the

Observations

Sometimes, leaders protect from evil Sometimes, leaders are the evil Leaders have authority

Do what is good

Be subject to them -- not only to avoid consequences, but it is the right thing to do

4		he is God's servant to you for good if you do evil, be afraid (for he does not bear the sword in vain) he is God's servant, an avenger to execute wrath on him who practices evil

6		pay your taxes for they are God's servants
7		taxes customs respect honor
