Exod. 20:2 "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage"

· Sixth Commandment

Exod. 20:13 "You shall not murder"

Someone could ask me: "Why do you use the phrase 'You shall not murder' – when the King James Translation uses the phrase 'You shall not kill."

· First little rule – Take a peek at the Language

The Hebrew word is "rasah" (Strong's # 7523).

Verb – "To murder, kill"

In the King James

slayer – 17 times kill – 4 times Other – 8 times

murderer – 13 times murder – 3 times

• Second little rule – Compare translations

Rom. 12:17-18 19 20-21	repay no one evil for evil – if possible – live peacefully with all no revenge – give place to wrath overcome evil with good
7.	2 Timothy 4:14-15 – Beware of those seeking to hurt you
2 Tim. 4:14 15 16 17-18	Paul recognized Alexander seeking to do him harm – may the Lord reward him according to his works you must also beware of him – for he has greatly resisted our words no one stood with Paul – they all forsook him – he forgave them the Lord stood with me and strengthened me – the Lord will deliver
