If the story of Rahab is an exception, what is the rule?

Foundational scripture

Exod. 20:2 "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage"

· Ninth Commandment

Exod. 20:16 "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor"

General understanding – disciples should not lie

Prov. 6:16-19 these 6 things God hates – 7 things that are an abomination to Him

Proud lookLying tongueHumble outlookTruthful tongue

Hands that shed innocent blood Hands to help the guilty

· Heart that devises wicked plans Caring heart with righteous purposes

Feet swift to run to evil Feet swift to edification

· A false witness who speaks lies True witness

One who sows discord among brethren Sowing peace and unity

John 8:44 "he is a liar and the father of it"

Rev. 2:2 you cannot bear those who are evil – you have tested those who say they

are apostles (and are not apostles) – and have found them liars

Rev. 21:8 8 characteristics – shall have their part in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone (which is the second death) – 8^{th} item = "all liars"

| Rev. 21:27 | 3 characteristics – shall by no means enter it [the future temple] – 3 rd item = "causes a lie" |
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| Rev. 22:15 | 6 characteristics – shall be outside the city – 6^{th} item = "whoever loves and practices a lie" |
| | Notice the exception of Rahab |
| Heb. 11:31 | by faith the harlot Rahab did not perish with those who did not believe – when she had received the spies with peace |
| James 2:18-26 25 | James gave 2 examples – (Abraham in verses 21-24 & Rahab in verse 25) second = Rahab – "was not Rahab the harlot also justified by works [behavior] when she received the messengers and sent them out another way?" |
| Josh. 2:1 | Joshua sent out two spies – to spy secretly – "go, view the land, especially Jericho" – so they went Rahab's house, and lodged there |
| 2 | the king of Jericho heard about it – "behold, men have come here tonight from the children of Israel to search out the country" |
| 3 | the king of Jericho sent a message to Rahab: "bring out the men who have come to you, who have entered your house, for they have come to search out all the country" |
| 4 | Rahab hid the two men – (verse 6 said "she took them up to the roof") |
| 4-5 | 4 comments |
| | men came to me, but I did not know where they were from when it was time to close the gate at dark, the men left I don't know where the men were going pursue them quickly – you can catch them |
| 8-11 | Rahab said to the 2 men – the Lord your God is God in heaven above and on the earth beneath |
| 12-13 | I beg you, swear to me by the Lord – since I have shown you kindness, you will also show kindness to my father's house to spare my family |
| 14 | men said – "our lives for yours, if none of you tell this business of ours" – "when the Lord has given us this land, we will deal kindly and truly with you" |
| 15 | she let them down by a rope through the window |
| 16 | "go to the mountains" |
| 17-20 | Rahab and the men – established the terms of the oath |
| 21 | men said – "if you tell this business of ours, then we will be free from your |
| 22 | oath which you made us swear" |
| 22 Josh. 6:16-17 | they departed – went to the mountains for 3 days when the priests blew the trumpets – Joshua said that the city would be destroyed, but Rahab's family would live – "because she hid the messengers that we sent." |
| 22-23 | Joshua said to the 2 spies – bring Rahab & her family out of the house |
| 25 | Joshua spared Rahab & her family – because she hid the messengers |
